SUBJECT: Reimbursement Rates

As with the income eligibility guidelines, the reimbursement rates are subject to change every year. Attached are the reimbursement rates and a current reimbursement worksheet for the period of July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

Additional Reimbursement – July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023

Section 3 of the Keep Kids Fed Act of 2022 (Public Law 117-158) provides temporary additional funding for each meal land supplement served. This additional reimbursement amount will be available beginning July 1, 2022 and ending on June 30, 2023. The law temporarily provides an additional reimbursement in the amount of 10 centers for each meal and supplement served under the program authorized by section 17 of the Richard B. Russell National School Act (42 U.S.C. 1766).

Additionally, the Keep Kids Fed Act of 2022 (Public Law 117-158) authorized a tier II family or group day care home described in subsection (f)(3)(A)(iii) of section 17 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1766) to be considered a tier I family or group day care home for purposes of the program authorized under that section for the same period. This temporary measure will provide tier II homes with tier I reimbursement only for the time period beginning July 1, 2022 and ending on June 30, 2023.

Changes to Reimbursement Rates for July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023

The paid rate for breakfast reflects a 12 cent increase from 2021-2022; the reduced rate for breakfast reflects a 24 cents increase from 2021-2022; and the free rate for breakfast reflects a 24 cents increase from 2021-2022.

The paid rate for lunch or supper reflects a 12 cents increase from 2021-2022; the reduced rate for lunch or supper reflects a 37 cents increase over 2021-2022 and the free rate for lunch or supper also reflects a 37 cents increase over 2021-2022.

The paid rate for snack reflects a 10 cent increase from 2021-2022; the reduced rate for snack reflects a 14 cents increase over 2021-2022; and the free rate for snack reflects a 18 cents increase over 2021-2022.

Reimbursement Rates July 26, 2022

The cash-in-lieu increased from \$.26 to \$.30.

The reimbursement rates for Tier I child care homes increased by 26 cents for breakfast; 41 cents for lunch and supper and 19 cents for snacks. The reimbursement rates for Tier II child care homes increased by 1 dollar and 15 cents for breakfast; 1 dollar and 45 cents for lunch and supper and 76 cents for snacks. The changes in the administrative reimbursement rates for sponsoring organizations of child care homes reflect a 8.58 percent increase.
