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## **CACFP Waiver Extension**

USDA Nationwide Waivers impacting CACFP have been extended through June 30, 2021. These flexibilities allow for meals that do not meet normal meal pattern requirements when necessary to provide meals to



children; meals to be served in non-congregate settings and outside of standard meal service times (allows for grab and go meals) and parent/guardian pick-up of meals for children.
