RE: DSS Child Care Fire & Life Safety Fire Watch instructions for Non-functional Fire Alarm Systems

For compliance with the International Fire Code (2006) section 901.7; whenever a **required** fire alarm system is out of service (broken or non-functional), the facility owner or occupant shall enact the following <u>Fire Watch</u> procedures <u>or close</u> the Child Care facility until system returns to working order.

- 1. Shall designate personnel to serve as a fire watch for the facility until the alarm system returns to service working order.
- 2. The fire watch personnel shall consist of at least:
 - a. One person per building,
 - b. One person per floor in multistory buildings, and
 - c. One person per fire area in buildings subdivided with firewalls.
- 3. The fire watch personnel shall have the primary duty of fire watch. They must patrol their area and not leave their area unless relieved by other personnel.
- 4. The fire watch personnel shall have communications, such as radios or cell phones to communicate to each other and the fire department (911).
- 5. The fire watch personnel shall have a way of sounding an alarm, for example, air horns or whistles.
- 6. The facility shall conduct daily fire drills until the fire alarm system returns to working order.
- 7. The facility shall keep written records of all fire drills per International Fire Code, using the standard form.
- 8. Notify staff, employees, students, and visitors daily of the fire watch and fire drill procedures explaining the need for increased awareness from all.
