New Grant Opportunity

A one-time grant is available to licensed or registered child care providers. License-exempt providers enrolled in the ABC Quality program and not operating in a school building are also eligible. The purpose of this grant is to allow providers to clean and sanitize their child care facility which may allow them to reopen; or to continue to purchase additional cleaning supplies or services necessary to keep the center or child care home safe and sanitary. CACFP Waivers Due to COVID-19

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) has been granted several nationwide waivers by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) to provide CACFP operators the maximum flexibility during this pandemic. Each waiver request form must be approved prior to the institution implementing any or all the flexibilities listed. Waivers will be approved on a case by case basis.

Best Practices for Staying Healthy

- Consider changing your sign in procedures for parents and other visitors (e.g., move handoffs closer to the front door to minimize parents coming into the classroom space and avoid possible exposure to children and caregivers).
- Limit visitors to the facility.
- The careful handling of your food service to children is important. Please limit communal sharing of food, and donations where possible.
